## Song 2: Tomorrow (Annie)

**Reader 1:** Please turn to page 2 for Mode Ani.

*(Before Birkat Hashachar, pg 10)*

**Reader 2:** In Birkat Hashachar we thank God for providing us with experiencing the phenomenon of our daily lives. We are grateful to God for helping us distinguish between day and night, for giving us sight, for guiding us, and for providing us with clothing. And we shouldn't forget, that we're never fully dressed without a smile!

## Song 3: You're never Fully Dressed without a Smile (Annie)

**Reader 1:** Turn to Pg 10 for Birkat Hashachar

*(Before Mizmor Shir, Pg 50)*

**Reader 2:** In Psalm 30 on page 50, Mizmor Shir is an appropriate introduction to the morning psalms because it emphasizes our faith that God will rescue us from even the most hopeless situations. We all know that God is with us and that the Children of Israel are never alone.

## Song 4: Close Every Door to Me (Joseph)

**Reader 1:** Turn to page 50 for Mizmor Shir

*(Before psalm 150, pg 88)*

**Reader 2:** In the next psalm on page 88, we praise God with trumpets, harps, drums, and cymbals. We're hope that God can hear our beat!

### **Song 5: You Can't Stop the Beat (Hairspray)**

**Reader 1:** Turn to page 88

*(Before blessing prior to the Shema, pg 100)*

**Reader 2:** In the V'ahavtah paragraph of the Shema we learn to fulfill God's commandments out of love. Not only must we do God's commandments with emotion, and with all our heart, but we must teach them to our children and to each generation, for we know that Children Will Listen.

### **Song 6: Children Will Listen (Into the Woods)**

**Reader 1:** Turn to page 100 for the Shema

*(Before Mourners Kaddish)*

**Reader 2:** After we all take some time to reflect during our next song, those in mourning and observing yarziets will rise as they reflect and remember their loved ones.

### **Song 7: Try to Remember (The Fantastiks)**

**Reader 1:** Page 136 for Mourners Kaddish

**Reader 1:** We hope you enjoyed the beauty of our prayers enhanced by our Broadway melodies. We will now end with Adon Olam to the tune of Summer Lovin!
