**WHAT TO DO FOR THE
SAT/SUBJECT TEST:**

Obtain a regular SAT/ SUBJECT Test Application Form. On the form, in the section for your test center location, fill in 01-000. The Educational Testing Service guarantees to arrange a Sunday test site. For more information, call the Educational Testing Service at 866-756-7346.

Indicate the Saturday date that is the day before you would like to take the SUNDAY exam, in the area designated for your test date.

With your application, enclose a short letter from your Rabbi or youth director explaining why you need to take the test on Sunday (a form letter indicating religious reasons is fine).

Mail in your application at least one week before the early registration deadline. If this is the first time you are registering for Sunday testing you must register by mail. Otherwise you may register online or by phone.

Obtain a regular ACT Application Form

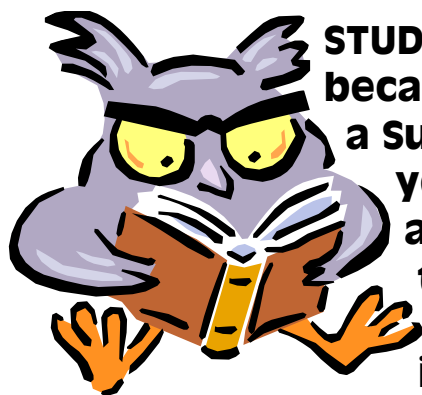
On the form, in the section for your test center location, fill in the test center code for the non-Saturday date relating to your test choice. NOTE: The code for Sunday test dates all end with a "1". These test codes are listed at the end of the section for each state.
